It is also why, although I knew it posed problems for him, I encouraged him to come to our 45th Reunion this past summer. He was a vital part of our high school class and I knew everyone would have wanted to see him. I can still remember playing CYO Basketball for St. Frances Cabrini with him and he being the only one with access to a car, we would all pile in and hand pool all the change we had in our pockets to give to him to buy the gas needed to get us to and back from the game. I will also always remember when our final year of pony league baseball Jerry absolutely crunched s home run that enabled us to win the championship.
