Harvey A. Lantz, 78 of New Sewickley Township, PA died on December 24, 2018 in Cranberry Place. Harvey battled stage 4 cancer for five months. Born October 29, 1940 in Weston, WV, he was the oldest child of the late Arthur Lantz and Helen (Butcher) Lantz.

Mountaineers, especially the basketball team.

Harvey enjoyed vacationing with his family, gardening, golf and Sunday dinners with the "lights of his life" Stacey and Shelli, family members and friends. After his retirement, during the winter months, Harvey could be found ocean side in Carolina Beach with his wife, friends and his buddy Maxx.
