Dr. Milo Mark Ujevich, 67, of Hopewell, PA, passed away surrounded by loved ones on December 3, 2025, after complications from a hard-fought battle with Type 1 Diabetes.

Born September 13, 1958, he grew up in Center Township and remained deeply connected to his roots throughout his life. Dr. Ujevich earned his undergraduate degree from The University of Pittsburgh, his medical degree from George Washington University, and completed his residency at Mercy Hospital. With a focus on emergency room medicine and radiology, he dedicated his career to serving patients in hospitals throughout the Pittsburgh area and helped countless patients through his decades of service.

Mark was preceded in death by his parents, Milo and Nadine Ujevich. He is survived by his beloved wife of 37 years, Renee (Ceccarelli) Ujevich, five children and their spouses: Mark (Chelsey), Matt (Breanna), Carly (Kris), Michael (Maddie), and Casey (Brendon), and six grandchildren: Milo, Brendon, Chase, Brooke, Sophie, and Kai. He is also survived by a sister and brother-in-law, Jan and Tom Bellhy, along with many nieces and nephews.

proud coaching his children's sport teams and helping with school projects.
